Our inaugural of the dept. features one of the top foreign Dmers in the club: David F. Gleason, 2520 Wellington Road, Cleveland Heights, O.

Dave began his DXing in the summer of 1958 and logged, according to his first list without use of a published log: WLX-890 and WVMA-620 Milwaukee.

Soon his ears became more sensitive so he bought an SX-99 to go with them. In 1959, his first report netted a verie from KTHS-1410 in Arkansas. Within a few months, nearly 100 reports had gone out. In the '58-60 season, Dave became acquainted with Dx clubs through special programs run by various stations. In January, 1960, he joined the old DXRC. After the club folded, several dxers persuaded Dave to join another club (Brand X).

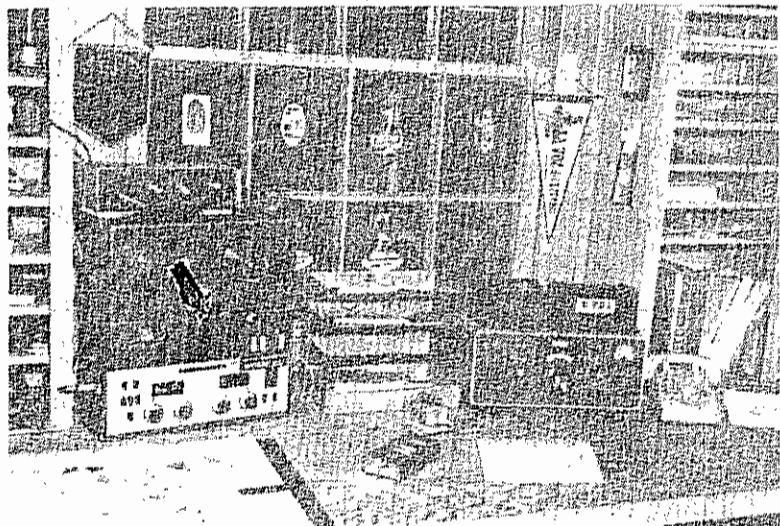
In 1961, Dave added an HQ-180 to his den. Concentrating on domestics, by the beginning of 1963, 1850 veries made their way into his home. In March, 1963, Dave travelled to Latin America where he visited stations in Central America, Colombia and Mexico. About 175 stations were visited in all on the trip. After returning home, Dave concentrated strictly on foreign DX. From a total of less than 30 foreign veries, he has now built his total to 225. In December, 1963,

Dave again visited Central America to visit stations.

Last season, Dave published a Latin American log which will be published again this year for the exclusive use of the NRCI.

Shortly, Dave will be moving lock, stock and HQ-180 to the city of Guayaquil, Ecuador where he will resume his studies and DX.

DX in EST for 3/15: KPOJ-1330 ID at 5:00 through KFAC. 3/16: WCGC-1270 RS at 4:51, WFBL-1390 at 4:56, WGUS-1380 s/on at 4:58, WHIO-1290 s/on at 5:00, WTOB-1380 at 5:06, WSPD-1370 at 5:07. 3/21: KOLD-1450 s/off at 2:00. 3/23: CKOK-800 at 3:09, KMTI-550 at 3:21, weak EE-830, KIKI at 3:14? WKCW-1420 s/on at 4:01, TT-1480 at 4:41, EST C&W-1480 from 4:40-4:57, who? KJOE-1480 s/on at 5:00 over another SSB, WCMB-1460 at 5:00 over another SSB. Unk 1260 SSB at 5:05. The first bulletin looked real good to me, no reason why the NRCI can't be a great success. Nothing noteworthy in DX with me--I have noted two Mexican stations during the day here on 1370 and 850kc. but haven't stayed with them long enough to catch their ID. I think both are in Mexicali but could be wrong. The biggest event in DX came today with a veri from Radio Belize in the mail. A nice letter from Lester H. Young, radio engineer, giving schedule Mondays to Saturdays GMT: 0600 to 0930 hours, 1200 to 1300 hours, 1630 to 2200 hours. Sundays 0600 to 1300 hours, 1630 to 2200 hours. They mentioned that their short wave service was suspended until June.

Hi fellas, time to muse. Managed to coax in a bit of DX this week, so here goes: 3/21-KVOR-1300 at 0237 w/request mx. Noticed they had a call from Texas--Houston, I think. XEP must have been off this AM. And finally, at long last, my first Wisconsin station came in--WKBB-1410 w/0305 s/off in the clear. Next I stumbled across new KRIK-960 in Roswell blasting in at 0323 with equipment tests, in the form of c/w mx with many ID's and requests for phone calls. I'm not sure, but I think perhaps this was their 1st test. Sure hope so, as I sent them a report. I don't think they have begun RS yet. 3/22-KLOS-1450 in at 0215 with f/c. MM 3/23- WYLD-940 led off with test at 0313, blasting in over KHOS. WCIN-1480 at 0343 w/test, followed by CBE-1550, fished out from KXEL/XERF squeeze at 0430. KJOE-1480 in/out of the mess at 0500, and at 0530 a surprise in the form of KORK-1340 atop the freq. briefly for a couple of pleasant ID's. WGAR-1220 at 0535, followed by WNXT-1260 in weakly at 0555. KLPR-1140 at 0615 w/c/w mx in the clear, and KFRM-550 at 0639 to wrap up that MM. All times EST. Do any of the Las Vegas, Nevada stations verify? Can't seem to get a verie from any of the stations I've heard there. Veries this week were from KALL (v/c) and KSCB (v/l). Been trying for the new Aspen, Colo. station, but no luck yet, although a couple of tentative ID's. I suggest we have NRCI Conventions earlier than Labor Day, as it is a bit inconvenient to those who have to be in school at that time. How about Palm Springs in '65? Guess that's about it good DXing to all. 73. (KENO-1460 v/l in '62 on f/up)

C.M. Stanbury II - Box 218 - Crystal Beach, Ontario, Canada

A recent QSL received from YVQX at Porlomar, Venezuela (see IDXD for VS, etc.) has some interesting ramifications. Porlomar is on Isla Margarita which is 40 miles from the mainland and was once recognized by the NNRC as a separate country. While I doubt that YVQX deserves such a status, it could lead to an interesting discussion. For example, the Dodecanese (Rhodes, the VOA's Courier) is counted by several organizations as separate from Greece even though their separation from other Greek territory is certainly no more than 40 miles. Meanwhile only two domestic stations have been reported this year and both verified promptly. They were CBLC/CBLK-1090 synchronized low powered CBC relays at Chapleau and Kirkland Lake, Ontario, and CFSE-1425 Senneterre, Quebec. I count CBLC/CBLK as one station, just as I would count the synchronized RTF transmitters on 1403 kc. 73s.

Hi gang! Greetings from the land of more snow. It's fallen fairly heavily around here, but it hasn't hurt DX any. Before I go into DX, I'll put in a good word about our foreign service. After 4 tries, I finally got a verie from Radika-640 in Surinam, by sending a taped reception report directly to the American consulate in Paramaribo. This week I received a personal letter from the station, apologizing for the delays, etc. (details in IDXD). Other veries have been LT8-830, WVOB-1520, and AFRS-780 in Puerto Rico. DX-wise, SM 3/22 was pretty fair, as I noted a 1kw. station in Ecuador on 870, "Radio Cristal" AN for a report. China on 1040 presumed to be the one heard around 0530, so Cx to the Far East weren't so bad. Then on MM 3/23 I was overjoyed to hear the NNRC DX Show from WDEL-1150 Wilmington, Del. for state #48, from 0400-0500. Now all I need are Vermont and New Jersey. No luck yet on the South Africans, though I've been checking several frequencies (notably 656, 665, 764, and 1025) around 2300 for carriers. The conditions for this area of the world should improve as summer approaches, as it's coming on winter down there. Thanks again for the phone call 3/25, Len Lockwood; sorry I wasn't home to check that SS on 790. Barbara and I will be in Mobile this summer to sample the Gulf atmosphere, and of course to be present at the first NRCI convention! I know Alex and Park will have an excellent program planned, and although the attendance may not be as large as that of the NRC conventions in the last several years, we are looking forward to the annual event even more this year than in the past. Friday 3/27 we will leave for Amarillo for a week or so, and plan to visit NRCIers Terry Steeden in Big-A and Harvey Young in McAlister. I am looking forward to comparing DX conditions there with the terrific reception I've experienced here this season. Incidentally, no veries here yet from U.S.S.R., China, or North Korea. Anyone know how long it generally takes? Also, only one of the Japs I reported (JOKR) has verified, with 3 reports still out to that country. Argentina is back on standard time now, so their stations will be signing on an hour later (e.g. LT8). I'm looking forward to a great spring and summer season here, as signals should be good all year in 1964 like they were in 1963. No signs of the Chileans on SRS yet, but they'll be rolling in soon. That's about it from here now. A big hand for the editors, who are doing a terrific job without complaining about their "thankless jobs." 73 to all.

After many static-filled MMs things seemingly improved and cx were actually fairly decent on 3/23. Here's how things went: I stuck with 550 kc. and first caught KOPR Bitte signing off w/SSB at 0201 after the "Sacred Heart Hour." Then, KOY, the interfering station, came up w/nx til their 0211 s/off also w/SSB. Those in the Midwest might be able to get these two, and even in the East of you dig hard enough. After those two left the air, KATY was left with I guess WGR, the former dominating. KTSA Texas came on w/ET at 0217, mostly TT. Jumped up to 1260 then to log KYA but didn't get a decent log before 1250 QRM got them. ND--ought to be stronger. Dakar-764 was in there but extremely weak. KGU-760 was in all morning w/QMCD and surged up to S9+a veritable 10db. 0245-0300, stronger than any Hawaiian heard here. I finally found out who the 1440 s/off at 0302 was, KGOY Santa Maria, w/SSB after religious programming. When does KUED s/off?
