We are pleased to inform you, that the contents of your reception report, dated October 28th, 1960, are correct.

I may add that we are very happy to hear from the greater Cleveland area, since up until we received our new Day Pattern permit, it was impossible to get into your part of the nation.

Our Day Pattern uses two towers, with 5 KW, and is practically non-directional. Our Night Pattern uses four towers with 1 KW, and beams our programs, NW by SE. The latter is the pattern we have used for 13 years, both day and night, until the new Day Pattern was instituted, March 20, 1960.

This Station went on the air in November, 1947, under the call letters of KVAI. In 1949, the call was changed to KLYN, and then in February, 1959, was changed to KIXZ. Our Studios are located at 112 W. 5th, on the ground floor of the Pioneer Hotel. The Transmitter is located in the Northeast corner of Randall County, about 12 air miles Southeast of Amarillo.

In closing, let me add that we were pleased to hear from you and are very happy to verify such an accurate report.

This station was established in 1922 and used the call sign KTSA until it was changed to KAKT August 28, 1958. On November 27, 1958 our call was changed back to KTSA.

KTSA is an independent operation owned by the McLendon Corporation of Dallas, Texas. This concern operates other stations in Dallas and Houston in Texas; Shreveport and New Orleans in Louisiana and Louisville, Kentucky.

We broadcast music and news type programming on a twenty-four hour per day basis with the exception of the period each week from 12:30 to 5:30 AM on Mondays, this time being reserved for equipment maintenance.

Our frequency is 550 kilocycles and we broadcast with 5 KW of Non-directional power during daytime hours (CST) and utilize a directional array at night.

Our nighttime pattern roughly conforms to a four-leafed clover figure with the 20 KW ERP major lobe extending in a Southwesterly direction since our transmitter site is situated Northeast of the city of San Antonio. Other lobes extend Northwesterly, Northeasterly and Southeasterly, respectively. Our transmitter is RCA (BTA5-F) installed in 1948 and the antenna array consists of four guyed steel towers each 407 feet in height. The transmitter location is at 4050 Eisenhower Road and the studios are at 1130 Broadway.
