Sometime ago we received your acknowledgment of hearing this station on October 31, 1960 at 6:01 AM. Somewhere in the mount of mail your letter was unfortunately misplaced. My apology for not answering your first report. This will acknowledge your letter.

Let me tell you something of our operation for your information. Our transmitter is located South of Highway 6 on old 9th Street, now know as South Boulevard Drive in Amory. Our studios are located down town in the Dalrymple Building at 110 North Main Street. Our equipment consist of a RCA Manufacturing Company type 5-D Broadcasting Transmitter. Antenna is 185 feet (overall height 190 feet) uniform cross sedtion, guyed, series excited steel tower. The ground system consists of 120 equally spaced buried copper radials 200 feet in length with 120-50 foot copper radials interspaced. 
